E-BIKES VS. MINI BIKES



E-Bikes

- feature a motor and battery that assists the rider while pedaling

See Hawaii State e-Bike Regulations



Mini Bikes

- Rely solely on a small engine (gas or electric), no functional pedals
- Designed for off-road use only

Mini bikes will be confiscated and HPD will be called if brought on campus.

VAPING
HARMS YOUR HEALTH

E-cigarettes can contain chemicals, such as formaldehyde, that can cause cancer.

Vaping can expose the user's lungs to harmful chemicals like formaldehyde, acrolein, and acetaldehyde, which are known to cause irreversible lung damage.^{1,3} Vape aerosol could be delivering metal particles like chromium, nickel, lead, tin and aluminum right into your lungs. Some of these metals are toxic.^{2,4}

Pursuant to [Hawaii Revised Statutes §712-1258](#), it is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 to purchase or possess any tobacco product or electronic smoking device.⁵

It is UNLAWFUL

Any tobacco product or electronic smoking device found in a student's possession is a violation of [Hawaii Administrative Rules, Chapter 19](#) and shall be seized by school administration and handled in accordance with the memorandum for Disposal of Hazardous Material and Electronic Smoking Devices Procedures.⁶

01 Fire Drills are conducted quarterly.


02 All other drills are conducted once a year during the 1st Semester of the school year.


