





VAPING HARMS YOUR HEALTH

Vaping can expose the user's lungs to harmful chemicals like formaldehyde, acrolein, and acetaldehyde, which are known to cause irreversible lung damage.^{1,3} Vape aerosol could be delivering metal particles like chromium, nickel, lead, tin and aluminum right into your lungs. Some of these metals are toxic.^{2,4}

Pursuant to Hawai'i Revised Statutes §712-1258, it is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 to purchase or possess any tobacco product or electronic smoking device.5

It is UNLAWFUL

Any tobacco product or electronic smoking device found in a student's possession is a violation of Hawai'i Administrative Rules, Chapter 19 and shall be seized by school administration and handled in accordance with the memorandum for Disposal of Hazardous Material and Electronic Smoking Devices Procedures.⁶






